6-WEEK PROGRAM DESIGNED FOR BOTH UNDOCUMENTED AND DOCUMENTED STUDENTS AGES 16-24 FROM IMMIGRANT FAMILIES IN THE INLAND EMPIRE REGION.

PURPOSE IS TO CREATE A SPACE WHERE IMMIGRANT YOUTH CAN FOSTER RELATIONSHIPS WITH MEMBERS OF THE COMMUNITY AND ENGAGE IN SOCIAL ACTIVISM WHILE DEVELOPING THE SKILLS NECESSARY TO ACHIEVE THEIR PROFESSIONAL GOALS.

- 1st launched in 2017
- Organizing 101, Know Your Rights, Social Justice History of the IE, and Civic Engagement as an Undocumented Student workshops
- Legislative visits to offices of local and state representatives
- Tours to colleges with undocumented resource centers
- Increased social networks with leaders + students
- \$500 scholarship

Youth enjoyed forming connections and learning from other undocumented individuals their age.


